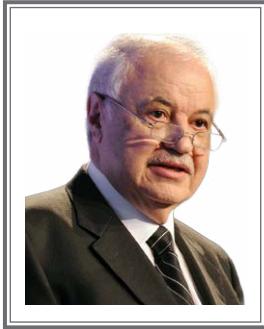


Redefining Education for a Digital World
